PRELIMINARY RECITALS

Pursuant to a petition filed May 28, 2013, under Wis. Stat. § 49.45(5), and Wis. Admin. Code § HA 3.03(1), to review a decision by the Division of Health Care Access and Accountability in regard to Medical Assistance, a telephone hearing was held on July 9, 2013.

The issue for determination is whether the petitioner's appeal is timely.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Petitioner is a resident of Outagamie County.

2. The Division of Health Care Access and Accountability denied the petitioner's Prior Authorization (PA) request (no. [REDACTED]) on April 9, 2013, and informed petitioner that an appeal of the denial needed to be filed by May 24, 2013. See, Exhibit 2.
3. On May 28, 2013 (postmark date), the petitioner submitted to the Division of Hearings and Appeals an April 30, 2013, letter from petitioner's provider, which the Division of Hearings and Appeals treated as an appeal of the respondent's PA denial.

DISCUSSION

Medical assistance recipients must appeal negative decisions within 45 days of the date of the decision or the date that the decision takes effect, whichever is later. Wis. Admin. Code § HA 3.05(3). If an appeal is filed late, the Division of Hearings and Appeals loses its legal authority to consider the matter and must dismiss it. The Division of Health Care Access and Accountability denied PA request on April 9, 2013. Petitioner submitted a letter from petitioner's provider on May 28, 2013, or 49 days later. Petitioner conceded in testimony at hearing that it was her mistake in not submitting an appeal request sooner. I have no equitable powers that would allow me to consider the fairness of the situation, and must apply the law as it is written. Because the appeal is late, I have no jurisdiction to consider it and therefore must deny it.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

There is no jurisdiction to consider the petitioner's appeal because it is untimely.

THEREFORE, it is

ORDERED

The petitioner's appeal is dismissed.

REQUEST FOR A REHEARING

This is a final administrative decision. If you think this decision is based on a serious mistake in the facts or the law, you may request a rehearing. You may also ask for a rehearing if you have found new evidence which would change the decision. Your request must explain what mistake the Administrative Law Judge made and why it is important or you must describe your new evidence and tell why you did not have it at your first hearing. If you do not explain these things, your request will have to be denied.

To ask for a rehearing, send a written request to the Division of Hearings and Appeals, P.O. Box 7875, Madison, WI 53707-7875. Send a copy of your request to the other people named in this decision as "PARTIES IN INTEREST." Your request for a rehearing must be received no later than 20 days after the date of the decision. Late requests cannot be granted.

The process for asking for a rehearing is in Wis. Stat. § 227.49. A copy of the statutes can be found at your local library or courthouse.

APPEAL TO COURT

You may also appeal this decision to Circuit Court in the county where you live. Appeals must be served and filed with the appropriate court no more than 30 days after the date of this hearing decision (or 30 days after a denial of rehearing, if you ask for one).

For purposes of appeal to circuit court, the Respondent in this matter is the Department of Health Services. After filing the appeal with the appropriate court, it must be served on the Secretary of that Department, either personally or by certified mail. The address of the Department is: 1 West Wilson Street, Madison, Wisconsin 53703. A copy should also be sent to the Division of Hearings and Appeals, 5005 University Avenue, Suite 201, Madison, WI 53705-5400.

The appeal must also be served on the other "PARTIES IN INTEREST" named in this decision. The process for appeals to the Circuit Court is in Wis. Stat. §§ 227.52 and 227.53.
