██████████ Respondent

The Office of the Inspector General requested a hearing under 7 C.F.R. §273.16 requesting that a FoodShare Intentional Program Violation determination be entered against ██████████ and that a one year disqualification penalty be imposed for committing an act that constitutes a violation of the FS program for the purpose of using, presenting, transferring, acquiring, receiving, possessing or trafficking FS benefits.

Prior to the administrative law judge holding a hearing, the respondent signed a waiver. Therefore, the agency may impose the requested sanction.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is **ORDERED**

That the respondent, ██████████ is hereby ineligible to participate in the FoodShare program for a period of one year, effective the first month following the date of receipt of this decision.

APPEAL TO COURT

You may appeal this decision to Circuit Court in the county where you live. Appeals must be served and filed with the appropriate court no more than 30 days after the date of this hearing decision (or 30 days after a denial of rehearing, if you ask for one).

For purposes of appeal to Circuit Court, the Petitioner in this matter is the Department of Health Services. After filing the appeal with the appropriate court, it must be served on the Secretary of that Department, either personally or by certified mail. The address of the Department is: 1 West Wilson Street, Room 651, Madison, WI 53703. A copy should also be sent to the Division of Hearings and Appeals, 5005 University Avenue, Suite 201, Madison, WI 53705-5400.

The appeal must also be served on the other "PARTIES IN INTEREST" named in this decision. The process for appeals to the Circuit Court is in Wis. Stat. §§ 227.52 and 225.53.
