The Office of the Inspector General requested a hearing under 7 C.F.R. §273.16 requesting that a FoodShare Intentional Program Violation determination be entered against ██████████ ██████████ and that a ten years disqualification penalty be imposed for misrepresenting that she was not receiving SNAP benefits from another state when she applied for FoodShare benefits in Wisconsin.

Prior to the administrative law judge holding a hearing, the respondent signed a waiver. Therefore, the agency may impose the requested sanction.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is **ORDERED**

That the respondent, ██████████ is hereby ineligible to participate in the FoodShare program for a period of ten years, effective the first month following the date of receipt of this decision.

APPEAL TO COURT


You may also appeal this decision to Circuit Court in the county where you live. Appeals must be filed with the Court **and** served either personally or by certified mail on the Secretary of the Department of Health Services, 1 West Wilson Street, Room 651, Madison, WI 53703, **and** on those identified in this decision as "PARTIES IN INTEREST" **no more than 30 days after the date of this decision** or 30 days after a denial of a timely rehearing request (if you request one).
