DISCUSSION

Petitioner (CARES # [REDACTED]) filed this appeal because he had been included as a liable party on a FoodShare overpayment connected to his girlfriend's FoodShare case. Prior to the hearing the petitioner provided documentation establishing that he did not reside with his girlfriend during the period in question, and the respondent agreed to remove him from liability for FS overpayment Claim No.

██████████. Petitioner no longer has an issue, but he is concerned about the propriety of the overpayment still existing for which his girlfriend is allegedly liable. Petitioner was advised that his girlfriend needed to appeal the overpayment for which the respondent claims she is liable. I thus will dismiss the petitioner’s appeal because the issue concerning petitioner’s liability for FS overpayment Claim No. ██████████ was resolved without need for a hearing.

THEREFORE, it is ORDERED

That the petition for review herein be and the same is hereby dismissed.

REQUEST FOR A REHEARING

You may request a rehearing if you think this decision is based on a serious mistake in the facts or the law or if you have found new evidence that would change the decision. Your request must be **received within 20 days after the date of this decision**. Late requests cannot be granted.

Send your request for rehearing in writing to the Division of Hearings and Appeals, 5005 University Avenue, Suite 201, Madison, WI 53705-5400 **and** to those identified in this decision as "PARTIES IN INTEREST." Your rehearing request must explain what mistake the Administrative Law Judge made and why it is important or you must describe your new evidence and explain why you did not have it at your first hearing. If your request does not explain these things, it will be denied.

The process for requesting a rehearing may be found at Wis. Stat. § 227.49. A copy of the statutes may be found online or at your local library or courthouse.

APPEAL TO COURT

You may also appeal this decision to Circuit Court in the county where you live. Appeals must be filed with the Court **and** served either personally or by certified mail on the Secretary of the Department of Health Services, 1 West Wilson Street, Room 651, Madison, Wisconsin 53703, **and** on those identified in this decision as “PARTIES IN INTEREST” **no more than 30 days after the date of this decision** or 30 days after a denial of a timely rehearing (if you request one).

The process for Circuit Court Appeals may be found at Wis. Stat. §§ 227.52 and 227.53. A copy of the statutes may be found online or at your local library or courthouse.
