PRELIMINARY RECITALS

Pursuant to a petition filed October 01, 2014, under Wis. Stat. § 49.45(5), and Wis. Admin. Code § HA 3.03(1), to review a decision by the Division of Health Care Access and Accountability in regard to Medical Assistance, a hearing was held on October 24, 2014, at Chippewa Falls, Wisconsin.

The issue for determination is whether the petitioner's appeal is timely.

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. The petitioner (CARES # [Redacted]) is a resident of Chippewa County.

2. The petitioner and her provider, S.P.O.T.S., requested authorization for a speech evaluation and speech therapy. The Office of Inspector General denied the request on July 28, 2014, and informed the petitioner that she must file any appeal of that denial by September 11, 2014.
3. The petitioner appealed the Office's denial on October 1, 2014.

DISCUSSION

Medical assistance recipients must appeal negative decisions within 45 days of the date of the decision or the date that the decision takes effect, whichever is later. Wis. Admin. Code § HA 3.05(3). If an appeal is filed late, the Division of Hearings and Appeals loses its legal authority to consider the matter and must dismiss it. The Division of Health Care Access and Accountability denied the petitioner's request for speech therapy on July 28, 2014, and informed her that she must file any appeal of that denial by September 11, 2014. She did not appeal until October 1, 2014. Because it is late, I must dismiss it.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

There is no jurisdiction to consider the petitioner's appeal because it is late.

THEREFORE, it is

ORDERED

The petitioner's appeal is dismissed.

REQUEST FOR A REHEARING

You may request a rehearing if you think this decision is based on a serious mistake in the facts or the law or if you have found new evidence that would change the decision. Your request must be **received within 20 days after the date of this decision**. Late requests cannot be granted.

Send your request for rehearing in writing to the Division of Hearings and Appeals, 5005 University Avenue, Suite 201, Madison, WI 53705-5400 **and** to those identified in this decision as "PARTIES IN INTEREST." Your rehearing request must explain what mistake the Administrative Law Judge made and why it is important or you must describe your new evidence and explain why you did not have it at your first hearing. If your request does not explain these things, it will be denied.

The process for requesting a rehearing may be found at Wis. Stat. § 227.49. A copy of the statutes may be found online or at your local library or courthouse.

APPEAL TO COURT

You may also appeal this decision to Circuit Court in the county where you live. Appeals must be filed with the Court **and** served either personally or by certified mail on the Secretary of the Department of Health Services, 1 West Wilson Street, Room 651, Madison, Wisconsin 53703, **and** on those identified in this decision as "PARTIES IN INTEREST" **no more than 30 days after the date of this decision** or 30 days after a denial of a timely rehearing (if you request one).

The process for Circuit Court Appeals may be found at Wis. Stat. §§ 227.52 and 227.53. A copy of the statutes may be found online or at your local library or courthouse.
