PRELIMINARY RECITALS

Pursuant to a petition filed November 24, 2014, under Wis. Admin. Code §HA 3.03, to review a decision by the Sawyer County Human Services in regard to FoodShare benefits (FS), a hearing was held on February 18, 2015, at Hayward, Wisconsin. FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. The petitioner (CARES # [Redacted]) is a resident of Sawyer County.

2. The FoodShare agency reduced the amount of an overpayment it seeks to recover for April through October 2013 to \$2,909. The petitioner agrees that he owes this amount.

### **DISCUSSION**

The department sought to recover \$4,087 in FoodShare payments made to the petitioner from April through October 2013. He challenged this, and the department reviewed its calculation. It now asserts that he owes \$2,909. He agrees that this is correct and does not challenge that figure.

### **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

The petitioner must repay an overpayment of FoodShare.

**THEREFORE, it is**

**ORDERED**

That this matter is remanded to the county agency with instructions that within 10 days of the date of this decision it reduce the amount of the petitioner's FoodShare overpayment occurring from April through October 2013 to \$2,909.

### **REQUEST FOR A REHEARING**

You may request a rehearing if you think this decision is based on a serious mistake in the facts or the law or if you have found new evidence that would change the decision. Your request must be **received within 20 days after the date of this decision**. Late requests cannot be granted.

Send your request for rehearing in writing to the Division of Hearings and Appeals, 5005 University Avenue, Suite 201, Madison, WI 53705-5400 **and** to those identified in this decision as "PARTIES IN INTEREST." Your rehearing request must explain what mistake the Administrative Law Judge made and why it is important or you must describe your new evidence and explain why you did not have it at your first hearing. If your request does not explain these things, it will be denied.

### **APPEAL TO COURT**

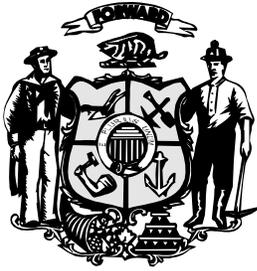
You may also appeal this decision to Circuit Court in the county where you live. Appeals must be filed with the Court **and** served either personally or by certified mail on the Secretary of the Department of Health Services, 1 West Wilson Street, Room 651, Madison, Wisconsin 53703, **and** on those identified in this decision as "PARTIES IN INTEREST" **no more than 30 days after the date of this decision** or 30 days after a denial of a timely rehearing (if you request one).
