The Office of the Inspector General [“OIG”] requested a Hearing under 7 C.F.R. § 273.16 requesting that a FoodShare [“FS”] Intentional Program Violation [“IPV”] determination be entered against ██████████ and that a one year disqualification penalty be imposed against him for allowing FS benefits to be used by others not on his FS case during his incarceration.

At the time of the May 5, 2015 Hearing, Respondent did not dispute the IPV, waived his right to a Hearing, and agreed to the 1 year IPV sanction. Therefore, the agency may impose the requested sanction.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is **ORDERED**

That the Respondent, ██████████ is hereby ineligible to participate in the FS program for a period of one year, effective the first month following the date of receipt of this decision.

APPEAL TO COURT

You may also appeal this decision to Circuit Court in the county where you live. Appeals must be filed with the Court and served either personally or by certified mail on the Secretary of the Department of Health Services, 1 West Wilson Street, Room 651, Madison, WI 53703, and on those identified in this decision as “PARTIES IN INTEREST” no more than 30 days after the date of this decision or 30 days after a denial of a timely rehearing request (if you request one).

The process for Circuit Court Appeals may be found at Wis. Stat. §§ 227.52 and 227.53. A copy of the statutes may be found online or at your local library or courthouse.
