PRELIMINARY RECITALS

Pursuant to a petition filed April 24, 2015, under Wis. Stat. § 49.45(5), and Wis. Admin. Code § HA 3.03, to review a decision by the Jefferson County Department of Human Services in regard to Medical Assistance (MA), a hearing was held on June 2, 2015, at Jefferson, Wisconsin.

The issue for determination is whether the petitioner is eligible for MAP benefits from May 1, 2015, forward.

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. Petitioner (CARES # Redact) is a resident of Jefferson County.

2. The petitioner was certified for MAP, a form of Medical Assistance, prior to May 2015. He was required to pay premiums to maintain eligibility. Due to illness that resulted in a short nursing home stay, he missed some premium payments.
3. The Department notified the petitioner that his MAP was being discontinued effective May 1, 2015, due to MAP premium non-payment. The petitioner appealed.
4. The petitioner is no longer in a nursing home. He has paid up his back premiums, and the agency has reinstated his MAP coverage effective May1, 2015.

DISCUSSION

The agency discontinued the petitioner's MAP due to premium nonpayment. He has paid up his back premiums, and the agency has reinstated his MAP coverage effective May1, 2015. The parties agreed at the time of hearing that there is no further issue to be resolved by this Administrative Law Judge.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The agency has correctly reinstated the petitioner's MAP coverage effective May 1, 2015.

THEREFORE, it is

ORDERED

That the petition is dismissed.

REQUEST FOR A REHEARING

You may request a rehearing if you think this decision is based on a serious mistake in the facts or the law or if you have found new evidence that would change the decision. Your request must be **received within 20 days after the date of this decision**. Late requests cannot be granted.

Send your request for rehearing in writing to the Division of Hearings and Appeals, 5005 University Avenue, Suite 201, Madison, WI 53705-5400 **and** to those identified in this decision as "PARTIES IN INTEREST." Your rehearing request must explain what mistake the Administrative Law Judge made and why it is important or you must describe your new evidence and explain why you did not have it at your first hearing. If your request does not explain these things, it will be denied.

APPEAL TO COURT

You may also appeal this decision to Circuit Court in the county where you live. Appeals must be filed with the Court **and** served either personally or by certified mail on the Secretary of the Department of Health Services, 1 West Wilson Street, Room 651, Madison, Wisconsin 53703, **and** on those identified in this decision as "PARTIES IN INTEREST" **no more than 30 days after the date of this decision** or 30 days after a denial of a timely rehearing (if you request one).
