FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. Petitioner (CARES # [redacted]) is a resident of Racine County.
2. On February 19, 2015, the agency issued a FS overpayment notice to the Petitioner informing her that the agency intends to recover an overissuance of FS benefits as follows:

10/1/2012 – 9/30/2013 \$2,337.00

10/1/2013 – 3/31/2014	\$1,496.00
10/1/2014 – 12/31/2014	\$1,533.00
1/21/2015 – 1/31/2015	\$ 65.00

The agency alleged the overissuance was due to the Petitioner’s failure to report earned income.

3. On April 2, 2015, May 4, 2015 and June 2, 2015, the agency issued dunning notices to the Petitioner.
4. On September 18, 2015, the agency issued a Notice of Administrative Action/Order to Compel Payment to the Petitioner.
5. On October 13, 2015, the Petitioner filed an appeal with the Division of Hearings and Appeals.

DISCUSSION

At the hearing, the agency presented its case, asserting an issue of timeliness of the Petitioner’s appeal as well as the basis for the FS overpayment.

The Petitioner testified that she does not dispute the overpayment. She did not understand the Notice of Administrative Action/Order to Compel. She stated that she wants to discuss a repayment schedule with the agency. The Notice of Administrative Action was explained to the Petitioner and she was advised to contact the Public Assistance Collections Unit about arranging a repayment schedule.

Because the Petitioner does not dispute the agency’s overpayment or Notice of Administrative Action, there is no issue for determination at this time.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

There is no issue for determination.

THEREFORE, it is ORDERED

The Petitioner’s appeal is dismissed.

REQUEST FOR A REHEARING

You may request a rehearing if you think this decision is based on a serious mistake in the facts or the law or if you have found new evidence that would change the decision. Your request must be **received within 20 days after the date of this decision**. Late requests cannot be granted.

Send your request for rehearing in writing to the Division of Hearings and Appeals, 5005 University Avenue, Suite 201, Madison, WI 53705-5400 **and** to those identified in this decision as "PARTIES IN INTEREST." Your rehearing request must explain what mistake the Administrative Law Judge made and why it is important or you must describe your new evidence and explain why you did not have it at your first hearing. If your request does not explain these things, it will be denied.

The process for requesting a rehearing may be found at Wis. Stat. § 227.49. A copy of the statutes may be found online or at your local library or courthouse.

APPEAL TO COURT

You may also appeal this decision to Circuit Court in the county where you live. Appeals must be filed with the Court **and** served either personally or by certified mail on the Secretary of the Department of Health Services, 1 West Wilson Street, Room 651, Madison, Wisconsin 53703, **and** on those identified in this decision as “PARTIES IN INTEREST” **no more than 30 days after the date of this decision** or 30 days after a denial of a timely rehearing (if you request one).
