PRELIMINARY RECITALS

Pursuant to a petition filed October 22, 2015, under Wis. Admin. Code § HA 3.03(1), to review a decision by the Milwaukee Enrollment Services in regard to FoodShare benefits (FS), a telephonic hearing was held on December 15, 2015. FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Petitioner (CARES # [REDACTED]) is a resident of Milwaukee County.

DISCUSSION

At the hearing in the matter the petitioner contested the determination that he had properly received his second Time Limited Benefit (TLB) month for the month of December 2015. See FoodShare Wisconsin

Handbook, §3.17.1.1, available online at <http://www.emhandbooks.wisconsin.gov/fsh/fsh.htm> The parties discussed petitioner's circumstances and agreed that if petitioner could provide further information to determine his potential for being exempt from the FSET program, the agency would redetermine his status. On the day after the hearing, the petitioner confirmed with this administrative law judge that the exemption was found for him for December and ongoing. The agency's representative and his Rescare worker also confirmed that petitioner was found exempt from FSET effective December 1, 2015 and that he did not receive a second TLB for that month. As such, there is no issue for determination.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The matter is moot.

THEREFORE, it is **ORDERED**

The petition for review herein is hereby dismissed.

REQUEST FOR A REHEARING

You may request a rehearing if you think this decision is based on a serious mistake in the facts or the law or if you have found new evidence that would change the decision. Your request must be **received within 20 days after the date of this decision**. Late requests cannot be granted.

Send your request for rehearing in writing to the Division of Hearings and Appeals, 5005 University Avenue, Suite 201, Madison, WI 53705-5400 **and** to those identified in this decision as "PARTIES IN INTEREST." Your rehearing request must explain what mistake the Administrative Law Judge made and why it is important or you must describe your new evidence and explain why you did not have it at your first hearing. If your request does not explain these things, it will be denied. The process for requesting a rehearing may be found at Wis. Stat. § 227.49. A copy of the statutes may be found online or at your local library or courthouse.

APPEAL TO COURT

You may also appeal this decision to Circuit Court in the county where you live. Appeals must be filed with the Court **and** served either personally or by certified mail on the Secretary of the Department of Health Services, 1 West Wilson Street, Room 651, Madison, Wisconsin 53703, **and** on those identified in this decision as "PARTIES IN INTEREST" **no more than 30 days after the date of this decision** or 30 days after a denial of a timely rehearing (if you request one).

The process for Circuit Court Appeals may be found at Wis. Stat. §§ 227.52 and 227.53. A copy of the statutes may be found online or at your local library or courthouse.
