██████████ Respondent

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The Office of the Inspector General requested a hearing under 7 C.F.R. §273.16 requesting that a FoodShare Intentional Program Violation determination be entered against ██████████ and that a one year disqualification penalty be imposed for respondent purchased infant formula for another person not in your household.

Prior to the administrative law judge holding a hearing, the respondent signed a waiver. Therefore, the agency may impose the requested sanction.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, it is **ORDERED**

That the respondent, ██████████, is hereby ineligible to participate in the FoodShare program for a period of one year, effective the first month following the date of receipt of this decision.

**APPEAL TO COURT**

You may also appeal this decision to Circuit Court in the county where you live. Appeals must be filed with the Court **and** served either personally or by certified mail on the Secretary of the Department of Health Services, 1 West Wilson Street, Room 651, Madison, WI 53703, **and** on those identified in this decision as "PARTIES IN INTEREST" **no more than 30 days after the date of this decision** or 30 days after a denial of a timely rehearing request (if you request one).

The process for Circuit Court Appeals may be found at Wis. Stat. §§ 227.52 and 227.53. A copy of the statutes may be found online or at your local library or courthouse.
