Subject: "Transitory Records"

Any communication generated by Wisconsin public employees through any means including written document, meeting minutes or notes, or any electronic media or platform is a public record and must be preserved and available to the press and to the public without restriction.

The public has a fundamental right to access any such communication, and any attempt by the Board to diminish the scope of available information or to curtail or impede unfettered access to such communication is a disservice to the public interest.

Informed voters will take notice of the outcome of this attempt to allow the public's business to be conducted in private, and will remember that outcome in November.

I urge to Board to rescind it's previous decision to limit the public's access to ALL records. Open government is good governance.
